old Many of the artworks in our collection have been around for hundreds (or even thousands) of years! Help us to keep them safe for 1,000 more by not touching. We recommend staying an arm's length (or 3 feet) away from all paintings and sculptures.

The Art Museum is a big place with lots of art to explore. Remember to **use your walking feet** as you move through the galleries. And remember to stay together with your grown-ups—you have the map, and we don't want them to get lost!

Remember that we can **only use pencils in the galleries**—no markers, pens, or quills allowed. We also ask you to remember that it's not safe to use the gallery walls or cases as writing surfaces. Instead, borrow a clipboard at the Visitor Services Desk.

If you get lost or have any questions about the Art Museum, there are friendly guards stationed throughout the galleries. Say hello, and don't be afraid to ask them for help if you need it.
