Photography

The Cincinnati Art Museum may photograph or videotape visitors for educational and marketing purposes. Attendance on museum property is implied consent for the use of visitors' likenesses in print, online, and display materials. If you prefer not to be photographed, please notify our photographer.



If you see the "No Photography" image, please refrain from taking photographs or recording video of the related artwork. Special exhibitions which do not allow photography feature a sign at the gallery entrance which states no photography is permitted. Flash photography, tripods, monopods and "selfie sticks" are not permitted.

general policies

Basic Safety Policies

- Please do not touch the artwork, frames, bases, walls, or protective coverings.
- Maintain a safe distance from all artwork. Two feet is recommended. An alarm may sound as a reminder. Please refrain from gesturing near the artwork.
- Food and drink are not allowed in museum galleries. Please enjoy refreshments in the Main Lobby, Schmidlapp Wing (Gallery 151), the Great Hall and the Alice Bimel Courtyard.
- Children must be accompanied by an adult at all times. For the safety of children and the art, wagons are not permitted in the galleries.
- Strollers, small baby slings and carriers are permitted, but we ask parents to be mindful of their surroundings.
- Touch and Learn exhibits are clearly marked and are meant for hands-on experience.
- Please refrain from running, yelling or disruptive behavior.
- Courtesy to others should be exercised when using cell phones.
- Smoking, including electronic smoking, is not permitted inside the museum, including courtyard and library balcony.
- For safety and health reasons, visitors should wear appropriate attire, including shoes and shirts.


Coat Room

All packages, briefcases, shopping bags and items larger than 11 x 15 x 4 inches must be stored in the coat room located in the Main Lobby or DeWitt Entrance Lobby. Lockers are available at no charge. Please store umbrellas in the coat room. The museum is not responsible for items lost or stolen. All items are subject to inspection and the museum reserves the right to decide what should be checked.

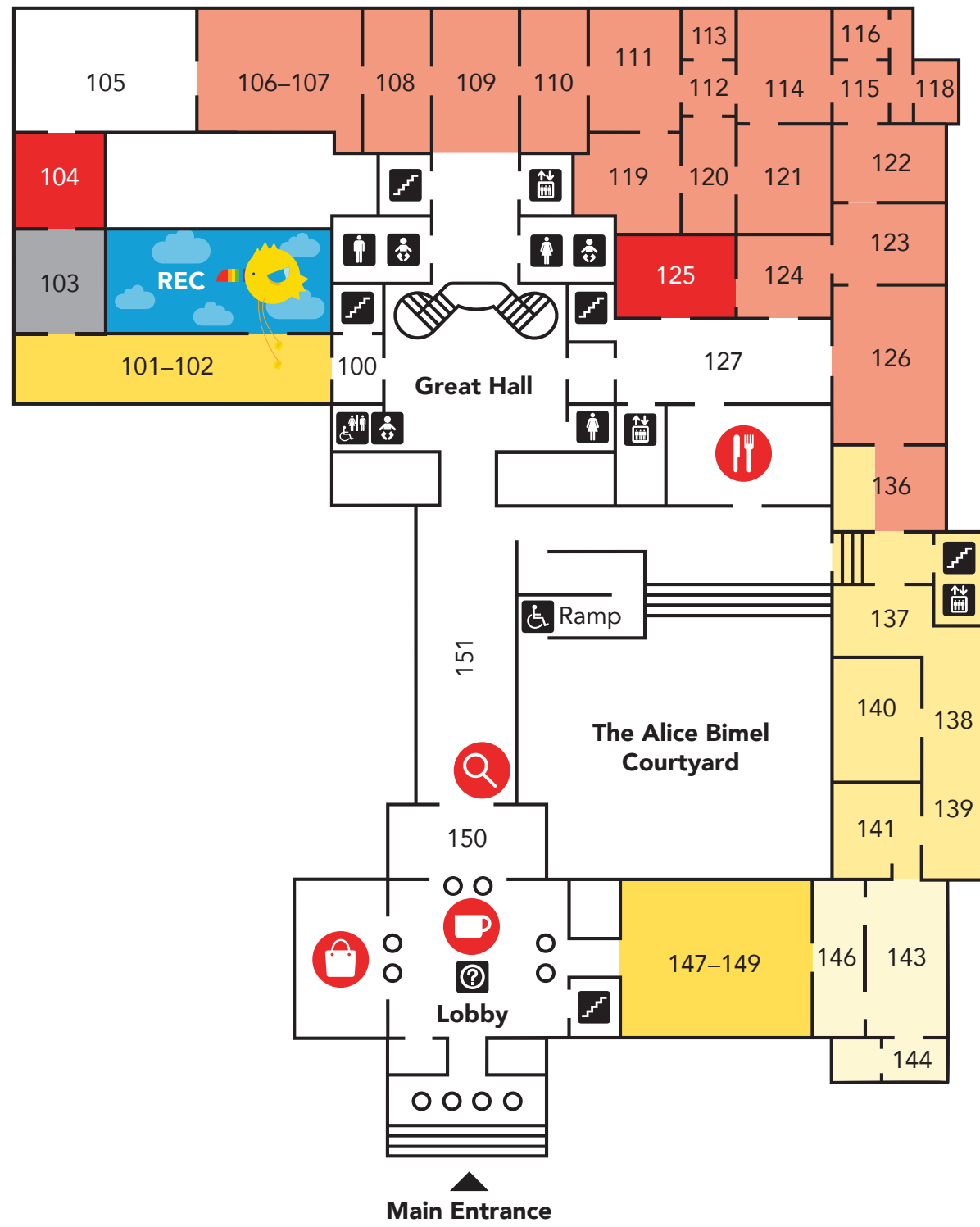
Wheelchairs and Strollers

The DeWitt entrance is handicap accessible. The museum also provides wheelchairs and strollers free of charge. They are located in the coat rooms by each entrance.

Sketching

Sketching with pencil and colored pencil is permitted in all permanent galleries during our regular hours, and does not require completion of copyist permit form. Visitors who wish to copy a work of art using additional materials must complete a copyist permit issued by the museum at the Visitor Services Desk. Visitors must give the completed copyist permit to the Visitor Services Desk when they visit. Sketching and copying is not permitted in special exhibitions nor of works denoted by a  symbol on the gallery label.

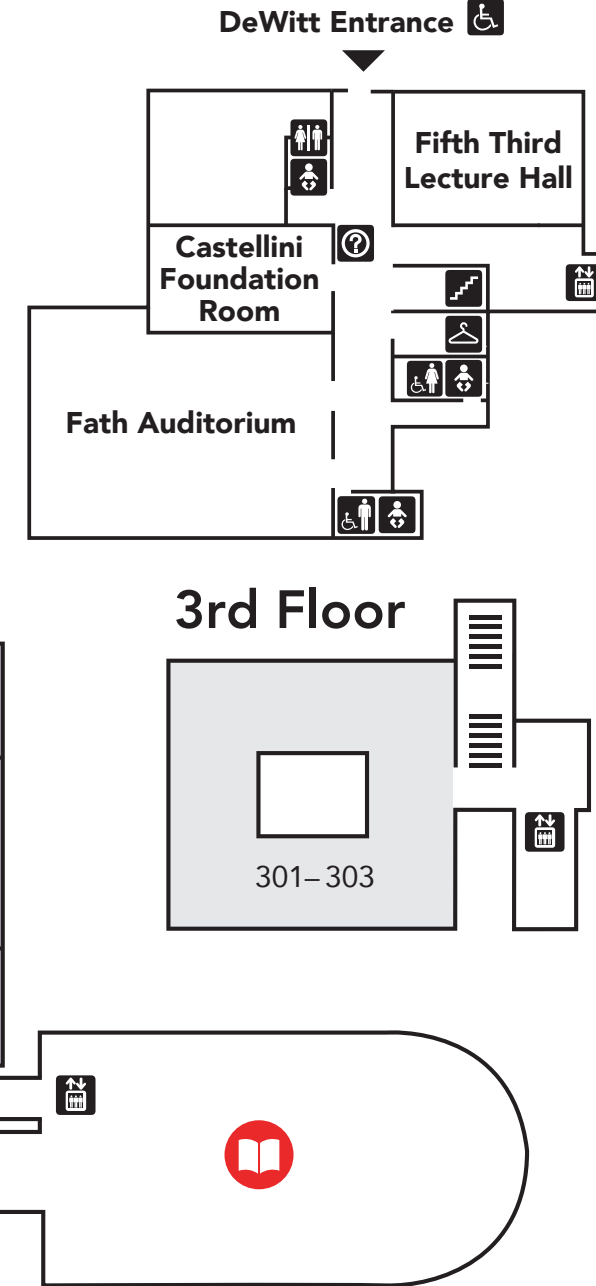
1st Floor

what to visit

- Terrace Café**
 Enjoy a delicious selection of art-inspired fare, friendly servers and a tranquil atmosphere in our Terrace Café. Outdoor seating may be available in the scenic Alice Bimel Courtyard in warm weather. Museum members receive a discount. The Terrace Café is open Tuesday–Sunday, 11 a.m.–3 p.m. A limited menu is served on Thursday evenings from 3–7:30 p.m. Café reservations can be made by calling 513-639-2986.
- Museum Shop**
 Find unique gifts and keepsake souvenirs based on the museum’s permanent collection and our special exhibitions. The shop is open during regular museum hours. Complimentary gift wrap available. Members receive a discount.
- The Mary R. Schiff Library**
 With a collection of over 100,000 items spanning 6,000 years of art history, the library is open to the public and has highly-qualified librarians to assist visitors. Located on the third floor in the Longworth Wing, the library is open Tuesday–Friday from 11 a.m.–5 p.m. as well as the second Saturday September through June.
- The Rosenthal Education Center**
 The Rosenthal Education Center (REC) is an interactive space for families to explore art together. Located on the first floor just off the Great Hall, the REC is open Tuesday–Sunday 11 a.m.–5 p.m. Thursday hours are 11 a.m.–8 p.m.
- Coffee Bar**
 Have a seat and enjoy treats and a cup of gourmet coffee or tea. Open during regular museum hours. Please note the Coffee Bar closes 30 minutes prior to the museum’s closing.
- MyCAM**
 MyCAM Art Hunts are digital tours that you customize. Choose from eight thematic art hunts to personalize your museum visit. Once you pick your hunt, you will be asked to pick five works of art, which are organized by theme. Stop by Schmidlapp Wing (Gallery 151) to design your tour today.
