CINCINNATI— Get your ducks in a row and bring the whole family to the Cincinnati Art Museum's FREE evening event <u>Art</u> <u>After Ducklings</u>, Friday, August 31, 5–9 p.m.

Art After Ducklings is a nod to special exhibition <u>Make Way for</u> <u>Ducklings: The Art of Robert McCloskey</u>, on view now through September 9. The exhibition honors the Hamilton, Ohio-born writer and illustrator whose classic children's books have captivated readers for generations.

Art After Ducklings guests will enjoy a free bounce house, live music from <u>Jake Speed & The Freddies</u>, meet-and-greets with <u>FC</u> <u>Cincinnati</u> players, <u>Freestore Foodbank's</u> Quacky the Duck, <u>Cincinnati Reds</u> mascots and <u>Alzheimer Association of Greater</u> <u>Cincinnati's</u> Moe the Elephant, family-friendly activities, and food for purchase from <u>Mazunte</u> and <u>Graeter's Ice Cream</u>.



Join <u>Cincinnati Playhouse in the Park</u> for "Make Way for Memories," an interactive and collaborative family workshop inspired by *Time of Wonder* by Robert McCloskey. Families will explore the everyday adventures they've shared this summer, then create a visual poem that represents those experiences.

Head to the Great Hall to take part in <u>Troy Gives a Duck</u>, a project that spreads smiles and positive messages one duck at a time. Participants will compose kind messages, then go out into the community to share those messages with friends, family or strangers.

- 6, 7 and 8 p.m.: Guided tours of *Make Way for Ducklings: The Art of Robert McCloskey*. Meet in the Front Lobby.
- **5:10, 6:10 and 7:10 p.m.:** "Make Way for Memories" with Cincinnati Playhouse in the Park. Meet in the Front Lobby five minutes before start time.
- **5–9 p.m.:** Guests may complete a survey for chance to win 4 tickets to upcoming special exhibitions *Life: Gillian Wearing* and *The Fabric of India*.
