# SUMMER SOLSTICE

A CREATIVE PROJECT HIGHLIGHTING THE FIRST DAY OF SUMMER

**GRADES: Pre-K - 1ST**

A finished solstice sun project

## **OBJECTIVES**

- Students will create a mixed media work of art by combining different materials.
- Students will learn about the first day of summer and the wonders of nature.
- Students will be able to create their own "sunny" sun.

#### CONCEPT

Students will be creating a mixed media work of art that depicts the Sun. They will use a paper plate, paper streamers, tempera fingerpaint, and string to create a vibrant and happy sun. The class will learn about the change in season when Summer begins.

#### **MATERIALS**

Paper plates, tempera fingerpaint, paper streamer, marker, glue and string.



#### **VOCABULARY**

Mixed Media – the use of various materials or artmaking techniques in a work of art.

**Summer –** the warmest season of the year, that follows spring.

Warm Colors - reds, oranges, yellows. Hues that remind us of the sun or make us feel warm.

#### **PROCEDURE**

#### Pre-class Prep:

- Cut the string, which will allow them to hang their happy suns.
- Cut 4 strips of paper streamers for each student, to make the rays of sunlight.
- Put dollops of tempera paint on a plastic plate.

#### **Artmaking Activity:**

- Students will begin gluing the strips of paper streamers on the back of their plates.
- Students will then begin to paint with tempera fingerpaints using their fingers or brushes. Students can use yellow and orange to create patterns.
- After the paint has dried students can add a face to their sun with a black marker.






